New web 2.0 tools appear each day. Many of these tools were not originally intended for classroom use, but they can be powerful learning tools for today's techno-savvy students and their more adventurous teachers. These sites appear (and frequently disappear) very quickly, launched by creative techno-geeks out there in the world.

Many of these tools require a higher-than-average set of teacher tech skills or some extra monitoring to assure student "safety," TeachersFirst Edge reviews these "tools on the Edge" carefully, and with specific ideas for using them safely and effectively in teaching and learning. Reviews point out any safety or policy concerns for the tool and offer links to management tips for each concern.

Especially popular is this subset of the Edge: BYOD Dream Tools: Free tools that work on any device. Look for the device agnostic tool tag in any review.

This is the world your students already know. Try teaching in their vernacular. A little adventurousness makes for powerful learning.



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



Using This Reading Trek in Class

Below is a list of ideas for how to use this Reading Trek in your educational setting.

Working with the Map:

- Introduce the book to the whole class on an interactive whiteboard using the Reading Trek map and highlighting its various layers.
- 2. View the 1930 documentary With Byrd at the South Pole. Discuss the technological changes in video recording or the relationships of the expedition crew with the sled dogs. You could clip the video parts you want to use with ytCropper (<u>TeachersFirst review</u>) and then use Kapwing (<u>TeachersFirst review</u>), an online video tool and editor, to create and share the short video clips you made with your class. Both tools are very easy to use. A brief 3-minute video with documentary highlights is also available.

- Download <u>Pocket Penguins</u> to view live streams and penguin cams from the <u>California Academy of Sciences</u> or the <u>Monterey Bay Aquarium</u> (between 7 AM and 5 PM Pacific Time), the <u>Idaho Falls Zoo</u>, <u>Penguin Beach</u>, or the <u>San Diego Zoo</u>. Teams or individual students can visit daily at a specified time and record their observations. In addition, students can microblog their observations using Twiducate (<u>TeachersFirst review</u>).
- Using only items readily available within the classroom or with another parameter, create a rookery. Take a photograph and share on Twitter (<u>TeachersFirst review</u>) using #mrpopperspenguins, including the reasoning behind two or more items selected.

Extension Activities:

- Where allowed, view the 2011 movie version of Mr. Popper's Penguins. Identify areas where the movie varied from the text. Use Poll Everywhere (<u>TeachersFirst review</u>) to ask students questions as to which version of each variance they preferred. (Note: Student answers will be anonymous, but students will be able to see poll responses live.) Additionally, <u>Heartland</u> has created a curriculum as a PDF to accompany the film.
- Create paper penguins using two sizes of paper plates and recycled/repurposed construction, wrapping, or other paper.
 Photograph the penguin in various school and home activities to share on <u>Twitter</u> (<u>TeachersFirst review</u>) using #mrpopperspenguins. For ideas on making the paper plate penguins, visit: <u>I Heart Crafty Things</u>, <u>Instructables</u>, <u>Love to Sew</u>, and <u>All</u>

- <u>Free Paper Crafts</u>. The art instructor will also be a good resource.
- Create comic strips showing a new act the penguins could perform on stage using Printable Comic Strip Layouts (<u>TeachersFirst</u> <u>review</u>) or Make Beliefs Comix (<u>TeachersFirst</u> <u>review</u>).
- Create a word search with vocabulary words from the story using Crossword Hobbyist (<u>TeachersFirst review</u>), or use the readymade <u>Mr. Popper's Penguins: Word Search</u>.
- Students may self-check for comprehension by using Mr. Popper's Penguins Quiz.
- Have students reflect through journal writing and illustrating after reading each chapter to demonstrate comprehension using this <u>Read</u> <u>Write Think lesson plan</u>


