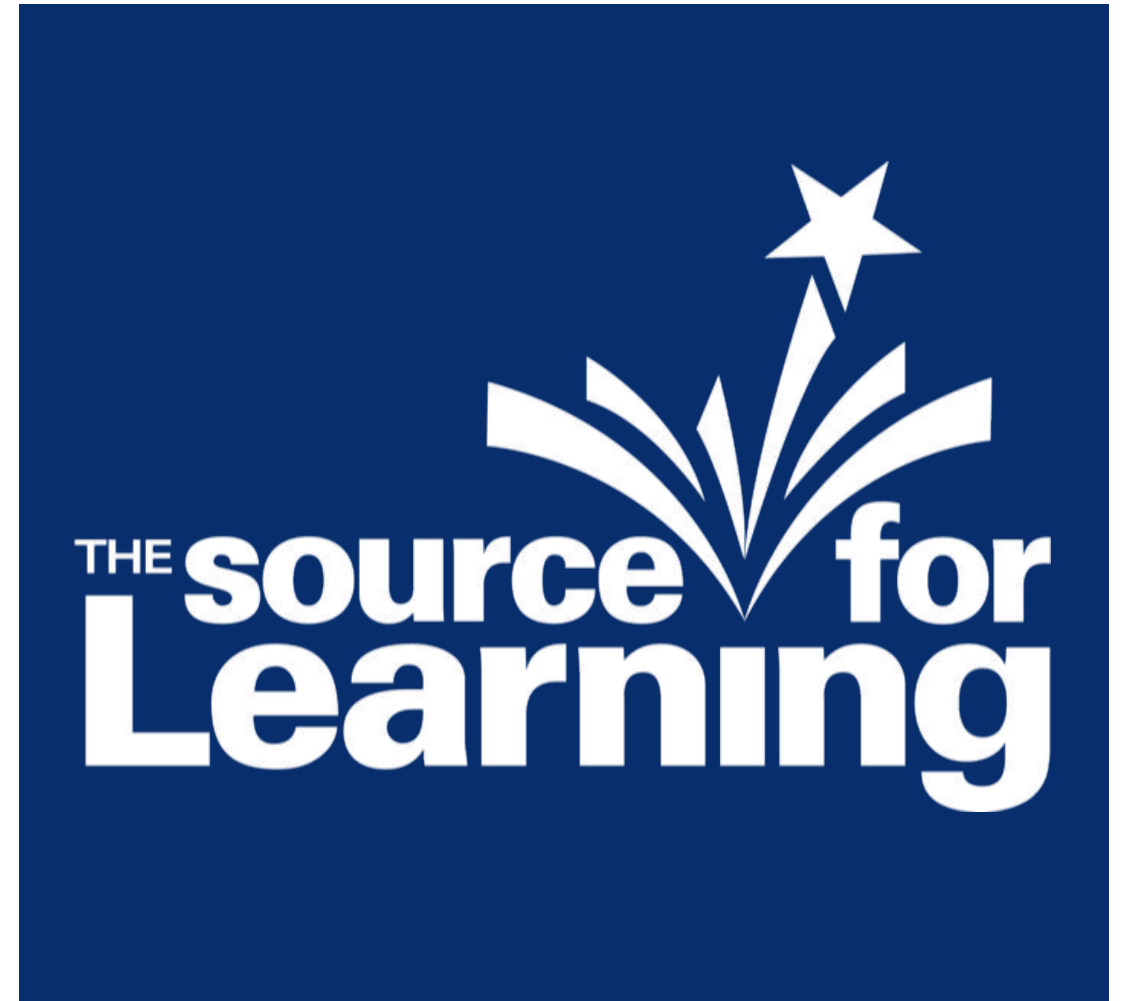

IN THE CLASSROOM
