1.	A map <u>legend</u> is another term for a key on a map. It explains the symbols used in the map and may also contain other map informatio	'n

- 2. The **climate** is the weather in a particular area: including temperature, precipitation, and wind.
- 3. **Cardinal direction** is a term used to describe all four primary directions (north, south, east and west).
- 4. A map **scale** shows the relationship between the distance on a map and the corresponding distance on the earth.
- 5. Map coordinates provide the exact location of a specified area with the degrees of longitude and latitude.

- 6. The <u>Great Plains</u> are a vast prairie region of the United States that includes parts of 10 states: Colorado, Kansas, Montana, Wyoming, Texas, South Dakota, Oklahoma, North Dakota, Nebraska, and New Mexico.
- 7. <u>Hurricanes</u> are severe tropical storms with heavy rains and high winds.
- 8. **Natural resources** are any substance that is made by nature and used to enhance the lives of living things. Some examples include sunlight, minerals, soil, and water.
- 9. A **port** is a place on a waterway with facilities for loading and unloading ships (cargo, passengers, etc..)
- 10. **Longitude** are the lines that run up and down the map (north and south) and measure degrees east or west from the prime meridian.
- 11. **Straits** are narrow passageways that connect two larger bodies of water.
- 12. The lowlands between mountains or hills are **valleys**.
- 13. The lines that run across (east and west) and measure degrees via north or south of the equator are called **latitude**.
- 14. **New England** is a region in the northeastern section of the United States.
